# Key Assessment Criteria: Being a writer



## Ayear 1 writer

## Transcription

## <u>Spelling</u>

- I can identify known phonemes in unfamiliar words.
- I can use syllables to divide words when spelling.
- Tuse what I know about alternative phonemes to narrow down possibilities for accurate spelling.
- I can use the spelling rule for adding 's' or 'es' for verbs in the 3<sup>rd</sup> person singular.
- Loan name all the letters of the alphabet in order
- I can use letter names to show alternative spellings of the same phoneme.

#### **Handwriting**

- I can sit correctly at a table, holding a pencil comfortable and correctly.
- I can form lower case letters in the correct direction, starting and finishing in the right place.
- I can form capital letters and digits 0-9.

#### Composition

- I can compose a sentence orally before writing it.
- Loan sequence sentences in chronological order to recount and event or experience.
- I can re-read what I have written to check that it makes sense.
- Heave spaces between words.
- Iknow how the prefix 'un' can be added to words to change meaning.
- Loan use the suffixes 's', 'es', 'ed', and 'ing' within my writing.

# Key Assessment Criteria: Being a reader



### Ayear 1 reader

#### Word reading

- I can match all 40+ graphemes to their phonemes.
- I can blend sounds in unfamiliar words.
- Loan divide words into syllables.
- I can read compound words.
- I can read words with contractions and understand that the apostrophe represents the missing letters.
- Loan read phonetically decodable words.
- I can read words that end with 's, -ing, -ed, -est
- Loan read words which start with un-.
- I can add -ing, -ed and -er to verbs. (Where no change is needed to the root word)
- I can read words of more than one syllable that contain taught GPCs

#### Comprehension

- Loan say what Hike and do not like about a text.
- Loan link what I have heard or read to my own experiences.
- I can retell key stories orally using narrative language.
- I can talk about the main characters within a well known story.
- I can learn some poems and rhymes by heart.
- Loan use what Laiready know to understand texts.
- I can check that my reading makes sense and go back to correct when it doesn't.
- I can draw inferences from the text and/or the illustrations.
   (Beginning)
- I can make predictions about the events in the text.
- Loan explain what I think a text is about.

# Number

- Loan count reliably to 100.
- I can count on and back in 1s, 2s, 5s and 10s from any given number up to 100.
- I can write all numbers in words to 20.
- I can say the number that is one more or one less than a number to 100.
- I can recall all pairs of addition and subtraction number bonds to 20.
- I can add and subtract 1-digit and 2-digit numbers to 20, including zero.
- Iknow the signs + =.
- I can solve a missing number problem.
- I can solve a one-step problem using addition and subtraction, using concrete objects and pictorial representations.

#### Measurement and geometry

- Trecognise all coins.
- Trecognise and can name the 2D shapes: circle, triangle, square and rectangle.
- Trecognise and can name the 3D shapes: cuboid, pyramid, sphere.
- I can name the days of the week and months of the year.
- I can tell the time to o'clock and half past the hour.
