What have we been up to?

Year 1/2 – Mrs Garnett, Mrs Aislabie and Mrs Niven

It has been another busy week in Year 1/2. We began the week by introducing our English text – Dogger. The children made predictions about the story, sequenced the events in order and performed the story, in groups, through role play.

In Maths, the children have continued to focus on our continuing skills.

On Tuesday, we had our first session of BLAST with our P.E. coach, Ben. The aim of this session is to enhance positive academic outcomes by ensuring children are calm, focused and ready to learn throughout the rest of the school day. This week, we played a range of tag games. The children had so much fun and showed fantastic listening and teamwork skills.

This term, in Geography, our topic is 'Our Wonderful World'. We were introduced to the meaning of physical and human features. The children then completed a sorting activity deciding which features are physical and which are human.

During our Science lesson, we learned about the final 2 animal groups... mammals and repti<mark>les. W</mark>e now know all 5 groups and were able to sort a range of animals into the correct category.

Our first week of homework has been given out tonight - homework that is given is to consolidate learning that has taken place throughout the week.

Y3/4 – Miss Humpherson and Mrs Peacock

Another great week in Year 3/4! The children enjoyed reading the poem from 'James and the Giant Peach', which was introducing all the characters he met from the book, for Roald Dahl Day – the children then interviewed their own friends, and wrote their own introductions, based on James' poem.

In RE, the children had a great time making their own elephant masks, in preparation for learning about the elephant god of Hinduism, Ganesh. They made sure to decorate them brightly, ready for a festival.

The children enjoyed their first session of BLAST this week, to get themselves ready for learning by getting their bodies moving and their brains thinking.


In Science, they have been learning all about the human skeleton and learning the names and functions of different bones.

We have explored descriptive and figurative language in our writing lessons, generating similes ready to use within our narrative to captivate the reader. We too are captivated by our class novel, 'Bronze and Sunflower', which has influenced our writing and the vocabulary choices we are making.

On Wednesday we celebrated Roald Dahl day, reading the first few chapters of Charlie and the Chocolate Factory, before designing and creating our own chocolate bar for Mr. Willy Wonka.

In history we have learnt that there are 7 key Chinese Dynasties, and we have ordered these chronologically on a timeline.

It was wonderful to meet some parents this week at our 'Meet the Teacher' event, we look forward to seeing you again at future events across the year.
