- Complete your order online and we will do the rest.



What have we been up to?







EYFS – Mrs Willington, Mrs Dobson, Miss Spenceley & Mrs Halliley

Nursery have had a fantastic week, with our story of the week being 'Leaf Man'. The children made their own leaf man and leaf girls, using natural materials such as leaves, conkers and pinecones. We have also celebrated 'British Food Fortnight', where we tasted Yorkshire Puddings, Scotch Eggs, Mashed Potato and Cheddar Cheese.

Reception have worked to make repeated patterns as part of our maths work. We have made creative pictures, handprints and cubes to make different patterns, using shapes and colours. We have also been using our senses this week - sniffing the cups to guess what was inside and then match it to the picture. The children could identify the different smells such as, chocolate, vinegar and mint. "It is mint, like toothpaste".







What have we been up to?

Year 1/2 - Mrs Garnett, Mrs Aislabie and Mrs Niven

We have had a busy week in Year 1/2! First of all, we attended the Kurling and Boccia Festival at Wolsingham Academy. The children had fun taking part in a carousel of Kurling and Boccia activities, which helped develop their aiming and throwing skills.

In our Geography lesson, we were introduced to positional language using a compass (North, East, South, West). The children then followed instructions, using compass directions, to navigate around a map of a safari park.

To celebrate Black History Month, we learnt all about Althea Gibson – the first black tennis player to compete and win at international level, despite the colour of her skin limiting her opportunities. Once given the chance, she became a champion and she also became a role model by opening up people's minds, showing that the colour of one's skin should not limit your dreams.

Later in the week, the children brought in their favourite teddy to share with the class. It was lovely to see everyone's teddy, and for them to explain why their teddy was special to them.

Finally, in our Science lesson we continued with our topic, 'Animals including Humans' where we focused on the human body naming and identifying a range of body parts.

Y3/4 – Miss Humpherson and Mrs Peacock

A wonderful week in Year 3 and 4 this week, learning the Ukulele with Mr Soler, who also brought in his electric guitar to show the children what they could be learning in his private lessons.

In History, they explored Skara Brae and used primary and secondary evidence from the site to deduce how people lived and what life was like there in the Stone Age.

In PSHE over the last few weeks, the children have been thinking about what makes a 'Nightmare school' or a 'Dream school'. They then thought about what our school was like and the most important thing that helps them learn, which they decided was 'being cared for'.

The children have learnt about what animals and humans need to eat to be healthy and to grow. They learnt about the 5 different food groups and how much of each they should be eating to be healthy.

In Forest school the children have been learning to whittle sticks and how to be safe when doing this.

Y5/6 – Miss Dobinson and Mrs Emery

What a wonderful week Year 5 & 6 have had, starting the week off with our science lesson, where we have been making connections between the size of an animal and its gestation period, and recording this in a scientific manner.

In writing, we have learnt what fronted adverbials and parenthesis is, including examples of these in our recount – a diary entry, written about Sunflower's day.

During our MFL lesson this week, we have been learning numbers in French.

In P.E, we have started to play basketball, acquiring the skills of dribbling and defending.
