

EYFS – Mrs Willington, Mrs Dobson and Miss Spenceley

We have continued our advent calendars in EYFS, ensuring each child gets to open a door. All children have loved dressing up in our Christmas clothes, saying, "Look it's Santa Claus!", "Me an Elf", "Let's put the Alexa Christmas song on", the children all exclaimed.

We have practiced their fine motor skills and enjoyed decorating their own Christmas trees, in both Nursery and Reception classrooms.

We've been reading so many Christmas stories, looking at the pictures and expressing what we can see. There have been some fantastic story retells that have impressed all staff.

On Thursday afternoon, EYFS had explored items that float and sink; their faces lit up to see if their predictions were correct.











What have we been up to?

Y1/2 - Mrs. Garnett, Mrs. Aislabie and Mrs. Niven

This week, we have been working hard completing our end of term assessments, showing how much we have learnt so far this term!

We have also been focusing on perfecting our Christmas Nativity, ready to perform to you all next week! We have been busy making props and trying on our costumes.

In History, we created a timeline of significant events that led back to the 1950's. We then focused on the 50's, finding out what it was like at this time. We looked at: how people were entertained; what it was like to shop; what jobs were like and what school was like. They particularly liked listening to rock and roll music, and dancing like it was 1950! The children then made a poster to show how people in the 50's were entertained.

In PSHE, we have been looking at celebrating our differences. In previous sessions, we created a gingerbread character and have been adding different clothing items to it. On these items, we have written lots of similarities and differences that we have with a range of people in our class.



What have we been up to?

Y3/4 – Miss Humpherson and Mrs Peacock

It has been a very quick week in Year 3 and 4.

The children have been working hard getting through their end of term assessments as well as preparations for their Christmas Carol Concert on Friday.

They have been learning about adverbials in English and experimented with different ways to use them in a sentence. The children came up with some brilliant sentences related to our book 'Stig of the Dump'.

Starting the week at scientists, to conclude their forces topic, the children conducted their own comparative tests to see if the size of a magnet impacted on its strength of attraction.

In computing, the children have been learning about how to conduct effective searches on search engines like Google.

Finally, in PSHE, the children have been talking about bullying and how they could help someone who is being bullied to feel better and made a chain of helping hands.









What have we been up to?


Y5/6 – Miss Dobinson and Mrs Emery

This week we have been focussed on completing our assessments, though there was still room for some fun!


