

What have we been up to?

EYFS – Mrs Willington, Mrs Dobson and Miss Spenceley

This week in EYFS we have been learning about and celebrating Chinese New Year. EYFS have worked so hard over the past week to make their own dragon, ready for our assembly on Wednesday, where we put on a performance for parents to watch.

All staff were so proud of our children for how confident they were speaking, this can be nerve wracking but they were great! Today, EYFS have celebrated the Chinese New Year by having their very own banquet. They had the choice to taste noodles, egg fried rice, prawn crackers and vegetable spring rolls! This all went down a treat, "More! More! More!", "This is great!", they exclaimed. Kung Hei Fat Choi! (Happy New Year in Chinese)

NURSERY - Nursery's story of the week has been, 'The Rainbow Fish'; the children explored their creative side as they made their own rainbow fish by putting the scales onto a template. They explored their sensory side with noodles in our tuff tray, "Ew they're slimy", "Are they worms?", "Look, I can get them with chop sick", they exclaimed. Nursery have also shown a lot of interest in the Chinese clothing we have had on loan for them, their smiles have beamed as they wore them. The red clothing was a firm favourite, as we learnt that red is a lucky colour in China.

RECEPTION - In Reception this week, we have been learning about Safer Internet Day and Children's Mental Health Week. We talked about how to stay safe when using computers and tablets and to tell an adult if we were worried about anything. We have also talked about our feelings, and how we feel in different situations















What have we been up to?

Y1/2 - Mrs. Garnett and Mrs. Aislabie

This week, we have continued with our theme of non-chronological reports. We have been finding facts about tigers, we have played a game to help us make our sentences better by using a range of sentence openers and we have looked at the different types of punctuation we use throughout a report.

In Maths, Year 2 have been focusing on measure. We have been measuring using centimetres and metres and then applied this knowledge to help solve word problems. In Year 1, we have been looking at 2D and 3D shapes. We have searched for different shapes in the classroom, we have looked at their properties and found a range of ways they can be grouped.

This week it was also Safer Internet Day; we read a story that made us think about how the internet can change people's feelings and discussed who we could tell if there was something online we are worried about.

In DT we have continued with our topic 'Taxi'. This week, we were challenged to make a moving vehicle, using a range of building equipment. The children remembered that they needed axels, wheels and a chassis to be successful!

We have also enjoyed completing our computing task on algorithms. We watched the story of Hansel and Gretel and then had to design our own house, using a paint programme. The children then typed up the instructions so that others could follow them, to make the same end product.











What have we been up to?

Y3/4 – Miss Humpherson and Mrs Peacock

With this week being 'Children's Mental Health Week', during our PSHE session the children thought about ways in which they can support their own mental health, and why something might help support their mental health or not. They then set up their own action plans to help support their own mental health and supporting others.

It was also 'Safer Internet Day' this week, and children were exploring how people can use the internet in positive ways, and how not all influencers may be spreading positive messages - this made them think about what sort of influencers they should be following online.

The children have been learning lots about fossils across the curriculum which has prepared them well in English, to begin writing their explanation text about how fossils are formed.

In Computing, the children have continued to develop their skills in coding and learning how to create programs that make characters do different things. This week, they learnt how to use a timer function to make a character do something after a certain amount of time.









What have we been up to?

Y5/6 – Miss Dobinson and Mrs Emery

To begin the week, Year 5 & 6 investigated water resistance – using modelling clay to time how long it took for the object to sink. We found that the larger the surface area of an object the longer it took to reach the bottom of the container. We discussed the ways in which our investigation remains fair and the different variables we have.

This week has been full of theme days, where we were able to develop an awareness of our mental health and how to stay safe online. The theme for this year's children's mental health week is, 'My Voice Matters.' We discussed the ways in which we can promote positive mental health — being kind, staying active and getting a good night's sleep. To be heard, all children in Year 5 and 6 wrote a message on their megaphone that they want to be heard, to show that their voice matters. As well as children's mental health week, we have also been reminded about the ways in which we can stay safe online. Our anti-bullying ambassadors gave us 5 top tips for staying safe — ask your child to see if they can remember them! Not only did our ambassadors provide us with top tips to stay safe, but they also reminded us about the age restrictions on games and the reasoning behind these restrictions. In lesson we learnt about online influences and how this is rapidly becoming an increased opportunity for young people — to become an influencer. We discussed the positive and negative impact social influences can have on society.

This week we have begun our final writing unit for the half-term; a newspaper report. In this unit we have already become journalists, interviewing different characters from our book, Clockwork, by Philip Pullman. All children were engaged in this activity which really supported them in writing the introduction of their newspaper report.
